Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

As winter bleeds into spring, the Church begins its annual Lenten journey towards Pascha. But rather than see this season of one of renewal and strengthening, we often view the Fast with anxiety. Many even opt-out of fasting, justifying their decision by dismissing the importance of abstaining from certain foods and activities.

So we must ask ourselves, why do we fast? What have we to gain?

If we look to the Saints for guidance, they tell us what is the root cause of human wickedness: self-love. St Maximos the Confessor writes that "self-love is the first sin, the first progeny of the devil, and the mother of the passions (sinful desires) that come after it." Self-love, simply put, is the will to put our own desires ahead of the

well-being of others. The opposite of self-love is "selfless love" (agape), which is the love that Christ tells us to emulate in the Gospel.

So how do we overcome self-love? We must follow the path of Jesus Christ, who taught us the meaning of true love. Through His suffering and death for our sakes, He demonstrated that love is an action, not a mere emotion. We love when we sacrifice ourselves for others.

And yet, it is impossible for us to live in such a way unless we first deal with our selfish desires. The Lord tells us, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). We must learn to deny

ourselves, and thereby put our selfish desires in check, if we want to learn how to truly love.

St Maximos also tells us that "self-love is an irrational love for the body." This is where fasting comes in. We need food and drink to survive and flourish; but we also tend to desire much more than we need. Our bellies control us. But when we abstain from rich and satisfying foods (like meat and dairy), we deny our gastronal desires, and strengthen our spiritual resolve. Joined to prayer, fasting is a powerful tool

in our arsenal against selfsatisfaction. And with the money saved on groceries, we are are able to give more to those in need.

It is understood by the Church that not everyone is able to fast. There are those whose health conditions prevent such. But the suffering they endure is itself an ascetic feat. When faced

with prayer, such health problems also become a way to overcome selfish desires.

As we enter into Lent, let us remember that asceticism is not a law, but a tool. The fast was made for man, not man for the fast. But for those who accept it, the fast is the necessary means to a glorious end.
