Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

It has often been said that prayer is the both the beginning and the end of the Christian life. Everything we do is rooted in this ongoing dialogue with God; and everything reaches its fulfillment in this same conversation. And yet, so few of us pray regularly. And when we do pray, we often do it the wrong way, or for the wrong reasons. After awhile,we become frustrated with praying, and we speak less and less with God. Why is this?

There are two thoughts that

attempt to dissuade us from praying. The first is, "What if prayer is not effective?" We live in a utilitarian society where the worth of everything is based on how useful it is. Prayer may seem like a waste of time, a distraction from the necessary work of solving our own problems.

But the reason we are tempted by this idea is because we have the wrong notion about prayer. Prayer should not be a list

of everything we want from God. Rather, it should be a desire to know God personally, intimately. Imagine if every time you saw your parent, spouse, or best friend, all they did was barrage you with things they want you to do for them? This is what we often do with God. We should seek out God in order to be with Him, not to have our wishes fulfilled.

There are, of course, things we should ask God for, as is obvious from the written prayers in our tradition. But the most important thing we should ask for in prayer is to seek the will of God, not our own. St John writes, "Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us" (1 John 5:14). Many prayers are not answered because we do not seek His will first. And even worse,

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we ask for things that we do not need, as the apostle warns us: "You ask and do not receive, because you ask amiss, that you may spend it on your pleasures" (James 4:3). The best way to seek out the will of God in our prayers is to focus on repentance, to humble ourselves before God, and to ask for His constant guidance.

There is also a more diabolical thought that discourages us from praying: "What if there is no God to answer?" This is one of many thoughts implanted by the evil one in order to sow doubts in our mind so that, once we stop praying altogether, we shall cut

ourselves from God. When faced with such thoughts, it is best to ignore them and not let them gain any

traction. Instead, we should continue to pray, asking God to overcome this temptation for us.

Ultimately, prayer is meant to be a movement of our mind and heart towards our Beloved—the God who first loved us, and demonstrated His love for us on the cross. Therefore, we must avoid letting our prayer become self-centered

or focused on what we want to have or want to happen. And according to St Theophan the Recluse, our written prayer rule is just the start, meant to warm the heart and teach us pray. We should continue praying throughout the day, striving for that goal that St Paul sets for us: to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thes. 5:17).


