Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

One of the amazing gifts that God has given to human beings is the ability to speak. Through language, we are able to communicate our thoughts and feelings to others. Our words have power, and they can either be used in constructive or destructive ways. When we are "speaking the truth in love" (Eph 4:15), we fulfill our original calling to be prophets of God (literally, someone who speaks on behalf of another). But when we use our words to hurt, to gossip, or to boast, we imitate the evil one, who is "the father of lies" (Jn

8:44). The Holy Scriptures and the Saints teach us much about the necessity of choosing our words wisely.

St James, the Brother of the Lord, tells us that controlling our speech is the first step towards spiritual discipline. He warns, "If anyone among you thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this one's religion is useless" (1:26); and then

tells us that, "If anyone does not stumble in word, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle the whole body" (3:2).

St Paul puts it in another way, imploring us to let our "speech always be seasoned with grace, as with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one" (Col 4:6). Implied in this advice is the practice of prayer. If we pray before, during, and after we speak, we invite God into the conversation. Prayer also helps us to calm down, giving us the strength to refrain from lashing out. As Proverbs 15:1 instructs us: "A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."

Perhaps the most frightening warning about misusing our speech comes from the Lord: "But I say to you that for every idle word men may speak, they will give account of it in the day of judgment" (Matt 12:36).

An idle word is one which is unnecessary, harmful, deceitful, slanderous, or vain. The 19th century Russian spiritual writer, Abbess Thaisia, writes that idle talk "begins under the pretext of conversing, of discussing some business, but then we proceed imperceptibly to an altogether unnecessary, empty, and sinful conversation. Like a deeply-rooted infection, this sickness does not easily submit to healing."

The antidote to idle talk is the purposeful practice of humility. Elder Sophrony of Essex would tell his disciples that they must attach themselves to

a humble thought in order to avoid

idle speech. In other words, humility is something we strive for, a goal that requires our attention. When we choose to humble ourselves, we are better equipped to examine our words before they leave our lips.

Spiritual progress is gradual, and there will be many mistakes along the way. Even the most careful of us will occasionally fall prey to gossip, judging others, or inadvertent

insults (often hiding behind sarcasm or teasing). For this reason, God calls us to reconciliation. With every slip of the tongue, there is an opportunity to repent, to ask the other person for forgiveness, and to restore the relationship that has been damaged. And if we are the recipient of harmful speech, it is an opportunity to forgive and forget. Of such things is the Orthodox Christian life comprised.
