Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Christianity in America has often been associated with an aversion to intellectual pursuits. You may have heard the insult that Christians "check their brain at the door" when they enter the church. It is often thought that Christianity has always been opposed to the sciences, and that all real scientists are atheists. But in reality, nothing is further from the truth.

In the book *Galileo Goes* to Jail, historical scholars explode the myth that science and religion are in opposition. This false narrative became commonplace in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, particularly when scientists were opposed by American Protestant fundamentalists (known for an extremely literal reading of the entire Bible). And of course, there

were some arrogant scholars who

proclaimed that science would eventually displace religion. But the historical reality is very different: science and religion were not always locked in a battle for supremacy.

During the Middle Ages, the majority of scientists were also theologians; and the same universities that taught science were teaching theology—as part of the same curriculum. This was especially true in the Byzantine Empire. Orthodox Christians were taught mathematics, astronomy, and natural philosophy in addition to theology. Some of the greatest Byzantine scientists were also theologians, such as John Philoponus (the Grammarian) whose physics would inspire Galileo centuries later. This is because Byzantine Christians did not see an opposition between science and religion. They believed the two worked together. Theology speaks to the questions of God's nature, and His plan for the universe; while science examines the universe God has created. Science can examine certain questions of "how" (the mechanics of the universe), but can never answer "why." Each deals with specific inquiries,

and also overlap one another.

Today, there are many exceptional scientists who are also practicing Orthodox Christians. They do not see contradiction between а faith and science. However, there is also a growing trend, influenced by fundamentalist Protestantism, to distrust science and medicine. Thus, we are called to discernment. When scientists make

unprovable claims (such as the claim that God does not exist), we must reject such ideas. But this does not mean we should reject all of science. We must gather the wheat from the tares.

Orthodox Christianity is not an ideology, it is true faith in God and His revelation. We have no reason to fear science, so long as we understand it as an exploration of God's beautiful creation.


