Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Christ is Risen! Indeed, He is Risen!

As Orthodox Christians living in North America, our lived reality of the Church is not the same as those who reside in Orthodox nations like Russia, Romania, or Greece. There, you can find parishes on every block, with a cadre of full-time priests paid by the government via taxation. Here,

we are fortunate to find a parish within driving distance, and must fervently support that community (both financially and otherwise) in order to sustain it. There, the culture and calendar conform to the traditions of the Church. But here, we are a small minority surrounded by religious ideas and traditions that are often incompatible with our faith.

For this reason, it could be said that a greater blessing exists for those Orthodox Christians willing to live their faith out in such a context. However, for us to accomplish this, we must be careful not to import certain negative practices into the Church. For example, we may have a tendency to exalt materialism and rugged individualism, seeing these as an expression of Americanism. But both of these ideas stand in opposition to the generosity and humility commended to us by Christ in the Gospel, and exemplified in the lives of the Saints.

One issue we American Orthodox struggle with greatly is the practice of obedience. We often err to one of two extremes. On one side,

we may assume that every believer must establish a monastic-like relationship with a priest or elder, deferring every decision to this person. But in Orthodox nations, it is uncommon for the laity to form such a bond with their confessor. Rather, their priest is consulted for spiritual decisions, and to teach us how to struggle against sin, not to tell a us what sort of car to buy. When non-monastics try to make their confessor into a guru, they run the risk of turning their faith into a cultic obsession.

On the other side is the temptation to make up one's own rules about how to practice the faith. Our American sense of independence and selfreliance can be a temptation to ignore the teachings and guidelines of the Church, and to think we know better than those entrusted with our spiritual care—our bishop They are called and priest. shepherds (pastors) because they

are responsible for leading the flock. And as the prayer at baptism states, we are called to be "rational sheep" in the Kingdom of God, and not self-willed wolves hiding in the pasture.

The Orthodox Church provides us with the perfect middle way of obedience, neither erring to one extreme or the other, so that we may learn the love and humility of our Jesus Christ.
