Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

It was remarked by St Tikhon of Moscow, during his tenure as Metropolitan of our Church in North America, that the holiday of Thanksgiving is the most religious day in our secular calendar. For this reason, he penned specific hymns and rubrics for the purpose of serving a Divine Liturgy on this day—a practice continued at our Cathedral.

The two most important activities for a

Christiantoundertakearethatof repentance and thanksgiving. With repentance, we become aware of who we are, and how much we are in need of spiritual healing. But there is also the risk that we will fall into despair, believing we are beyond God's mercy. Constant thanksgiving is a counter-weight to this.

When we take time to remember all the blessings God has given us, and to thank Him for

these things, we experience joy and peace within our hearts. In addition, we will feel contented with what we have, rather than coveting what we do not. In this way, thanksgiving completes the work of repentance, bringing us into the very presence of God.

In order to give thanks properly, we must keep in mind that, although it is an action directed towards God, He does not gain from it. The Trinity does need anything from us; rather, it is we who are transformed by the act of thanksgiving. It humbles us, and makes us aware of how needy we truly are. St Paul asks, "What do you have that you did not receive? If then you received it, why do you boast as if you did not receive it?" (1 Cor 4:7). God is the source of all things. Every breath we take is a gift from the One who upholds and blesses the universe at every moment. When we bring this to mind, extreme gratitude is the proper response.

Also, we must avoid the assumption that only pleasant things come from God. The Holy Scriptures teach us that God also allows us to undergo trials and temptations, either to chasten

us for our lack of faith, or to perfect us. Although God Himself is not the source of any evil thing, He allows these difficulties for our salvation. Such experiences may be pedagogical; or they may serve to strengthen our resolve.

As we are faced with the rigmarole of daily life, as well as the occasional extraordinary blessing or heartbreaking tragedy, thanksgiving

ensures that we bring God into every aspect of our lives. Without it, we are constantly tempted to think we are self-sufficient, and that our successes and failures are merely the product of our own decisions. And worse, we may begin to think that we are in control of our destiny. When we always remember to thank God, He will become our constant companion on this journey of life.
