Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

The liturgical services of the Orthodox Church are like a beautiful tapestry, woven primarily from strands of the Holy Scriptures. This is especially true at the Feast of the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ. Many of the Old Testament prophecies are read or chanted, as well as the New Testament fulfillment of these prophecies. To understand the Orthodox faith—in other words, to understand who God is, who

we are, and what is our purpose—we must enter deeply into the Bible as understood in our worship.

In one of the primary readings sung or read (from Isaiah), we hear "Understand all you nations and submit yourselves, for God is with us!" The nations (or Gentiles) represent all those outside of

Israel. The reading goes on to declare:

Behold, I and the children whom God has given me are signs and portents in Israel from the Lord of Hosts. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. To those who dwell in the land of the shadow of death, a light is risen. For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given.

The birth of the Messiah (*Christos* in Greek) is the announcement of salvation to all who believe, both Israel and the Gentiles.

It is the same prophet who also declares, "Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a Son, and shall call his name Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us'" (Isaiah 7:14). This passage is read at both the

Sixth Hour and the Vesperal Liturgy, appointed for the morning of Christmas Eve. These prophecies are fulfilled in the conception of Jesus in the womb of the Theotokos, as emphasized later with the reading of Luke's Gospel. By relating this biblical sign, it is again confirmed that Jesus is the Christ.

During the Great Compline of Christmas Eve, we first sing the troparion hymn for Nativity: "Your Nativity, O Christ our God, has shown to the world the light of knowledge; for by it those who worshipped

the stars were taught by a star to adore You, the Sun of Righteousness, and to know you - the Dayspring from on high - O Lord, glory to You!"

In this hymn, the Magi from Persia, who represent the Gentiles and their learning (astronomy), are led to the true Light, Jesus Christ. He is the "Sun of Righteousness"

(Malachi 4:2) and the "Dayspring from on high" (Luke 1:78) - literally, the eastern daystar. In the worship of the three sages, we witness the first bowing down of all the nations to the Messiah, which foreshadows the ministry of the Apostles as they shine the light of Christ on the whole universe.

As we likewise join our voices of praise to theirs, let us embody the light and let it illumine all of our thoughts, words, and deeds—both now and throughout the year to come.
