Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!

Aswecontinue our journey through Paschaltide, moving through the month of June towards the Ascension of our Lord and Holy Pentecost, we must be careful not to let our zeal wane. The joy of the Resurrection points us toward our personal participation in the coming of the Holy Spirit, just as our Lord Jesus Christ promised to the

Apostles. On the day of Pentecost, earthen vessels were filled with divine life by the indwelling of God. And those of us who now receive this gift in the Church are already experiencing the reign of Christ in the heavens.

The gift of the Spirit is an objective reality for Orthodox Christians. We receive him in our baptism and chrismation. But this does not mean that the Spirit suddenly commandeers our will, forcing us

to follow God's law. On the contrary, God never takes away our freedom to choose; he never overcomes our will or compels us to act. We must *learn* to cooperate with the will of God, and *allow* the Spirit to act in and through us. As St Diadochus of Photiki wrote in the 5th century: "From the instant we are baptized, grace is hidden in the depths of the mind," until someone begins to cooperate with the Spirit, and then "grace communicates something of its riches to the soul."

Perhaps one of the most common themes in St Paul's epistles is his exhortation for Christians to live up to the calling they accepted when they were baptized. He often warns us not to make excuses for sins. He writes to the Galatians: "Now the deeds of the flesh are evident—sexual immorality, impurity, lewdness,

idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, disputes, dissensions, factions, envying, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these . . .those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God" (5:19-21).

Some of the sins that St Paul mentions are particularly heinous because they involve attacking others. Fomenting strife and dissensions, which could in turn lead to factions, is especially evil. Usually, this begins with gossip. While gossip often seems harmless

(or even enjoyable to some), it quickly

snowballs. The person who is the subject of the gossip is not given an opportunity to defend herself. And those hearing the gossip have no way of knowing if what is said is true, false, or simply exaggerated.

What comes from our mouths, and what we say to others and *about* others, should be a reflection of our life in the Spirit. "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building

up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear" (Eph 4:29). To avoid sin, we must consciously refrain from gossiping and causing dissensions through our words. And to accomplish this, we must cooperate with the Holy Spirit that dwells within us, seeking his strength through prayer in order to accomplish his will in action.

May the light of Pentecost transform even our tongues, that we may also speak God's truth in love.
