Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

I Occasionally see a bumper sticker on cars (right next to their "fish" decal) that states: "Forget the religion, Christ is risen!" The obvious statement this person is making is that they reject any sort of institutional religion, and assumes they believe that any sort of structure, ritual, or tradition is unnecessary for Christianity. We could glibly respond, "If you want disorganized religion, then come to the Orthodox Church!" (another bumper sticker I've seen around).

All joking aside, there is a kernel of truth in this attack on "religion," if by religion we mean that Orthodox Christianity is just like every other system of belief such as Islam, Buddhism, or Hinduism. If we believe our faith to be revealed directly by God, and therefore the truth, then it is unlike any of these religions of men. Wherever they agree with us, it is commendable; but

wherever they disagree, it is because their founders did not have access to divine revelation.

There is another problem with thinking that our faith is simply another religion: it will then take second place to our normal day-to-day existence. Fr. Alexander Schmemann famously referred to this as the "heresy of secularism." This is when our faith is only surface-deep—a nice addition to our lives, but really only a decorative embellishment. Such a view mutes the radical message of the Gospel, and the example and teaching given to us by our Lord Jesus Christ.

Our Lord did not become man, die for our sakes, and rise again just to make our lives more comfortable; nor simply to give us something to look forward to in the future (after death); he did these

things in order to transform our lives. St Paul asks, "Do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we were buried with him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life" (Rom 6:3-4). We are called to participate in the risen life of Christ here and now, and to be deeply changed by this.

The danger we must avoid, then, is to diminish our religion by putting the "practical"

things of the world first. This is our constant temptation. We often take our queues on what we think, how we live, and how we treat others from secular sources. "Beware," the Apostle tells us, "lest anyone cheat you through philosophy and empty deceit, according to the tradition of men, according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ" (Col 2:8).

The way Christ has shown us is so much greater than this. He has taught us to love and forgive our enemies, and to plant the garden of Paradise in this broken world of ours. And not only does he teach us this, he enables us to do so through the gift of the Holy Spirit he first sent to us after his resurrection on the third day. A life lived in Christ, through the Spirit, could never be compared to mere religion, for it is the power of God in his people.

May each of you experience a blessed close of the Great Fast, and a wondrous and beautiful Pascha.
