Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

In his Epistle to the Romans, St Paul writes, "I want you to be wise in what is good, and simple concerning evil" (16:19). A recurring theme in the Scriptures is that the ideal for a Christian is to attain unto a certain simplicity and guilelessness regarding the ways of the world. Jesus Christ compares this

life to that of an innocent child: "I say to you, unless you are converted and become as little children, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven; therefore whoever humbles himself as this little child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven" (Matt 18:3-4).

One of the ways we attain to this ideal is to strive to live a simple life. In 1

Thessalonians 4:10-11, we read, "We urge you, brethren, that you...aspire to lead a quiet life, to mind your own business, and to work with your own hands." The Book of Proverbs also says much about putting your nose to the grindstone, serving God through your daily labors, and not seeking what is beyond our necessities. Through this sort of simple life, we avoid the distractions of wealth, fame, and the constant pursuit of pleasure.

Simplicity of life is not only a reflection of one's character; it is also a catalyst for spiritual

change. When we let go of the busy-ness and unnecessary stresses of life, and focus more on our internal life, it has a profound effect on everything we experience and do. It is a step back from the madness of a world that keeps moving faster and faster. It is to opt out of the chaos in order to discover peace, clarity, and enjoyment in the beautiful and basic things of life.

Pursuit of a simple life enables us to deeply participate in the essential reality of human existence. Things like food and drink, marriage and raising a family, life and death are taken up into the mystery of Christ; and time conforms itself to the cycle of worship and prayer, feast and fast, where everything

has purpose.

Many Americans see January as a time to make resolutions. Often these pertain to worldly programs of self-improvement: lose weight, learn a new skill, become more successful. Instead, let us resolve to simplify our lives, working to put Christ at the center and making every moment meaningful and enduring.
