Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Living as an Orthodox Christian today is a difficult task because we are surrounded by so many temptations. Technology has made it more convenient to satisfy our desires, which has led to a decrease in religious life and an increase in selfishness and addictive behaviors. Of course, the Orthodox spiritual life offers tools to push back against the allure of the world. But yet there is another problem we run into: our ego.

One of the phrases a priest often hears from parishioners and inquirers is, "I agree / disagree with [fill in the blank]." The assumption behind this statement is that the individual is the sole judge of what is correct or incorrect, right or wrong. A very modern idea, it elevates our own reasoning above the mind of the community—the

Church spread across space and time. At the very least, this stance allows for a rejection of specific Orthodox doctrines. But at its worse, it leads to the sort of chaos described at the close of the Book of Judges: "Everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (21:25).

To approach our faith from this angle is to come at it in the wrong way. It is to assume that Orthodox Christianity is a simply a list of ideas, each independent from the other, which can then be examined and either approved or discarded based on one's personal analysis. This method makes our religion into just one more ideology like all the rest, a system that can be evaluated and tinkered with based on our pre-established views.

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But our faith is not a system but a way of life. It is entirely holistic, with each part of universal doctrine and practice complementing, supporting, informing, and building on every other part. And more importantly, it is divinely-revealed, not man-made. As enshrined in the Synodikon of Orthodoxy, we believe "as the prophets have seen, as the apostles have taught, as the Church

has received." How then can we impose our own standards on a faith handed to us by God?

We should never ask, "Must I believe such-and-such doctrine to be Orthodox?" Rather, we should strive to live and embody the fullness of the faith. We may not understand every aspect of it; but neither do we understand every aspect of a jet plane before we trust that it will get us to our destination. It is impossible

to fully comprehend any complex reality, let alone the infinite mysteries of faith. God is not asking this of us; he is asking us to trust him, love him, and serve him.

St. Paul instructs us to bring "every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor 10:5). Instead of subjecting Orthodoxy to our own standards, let us subject our thoughts to the Lord.
