Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

It has long been observed that modern society is defined by a culture of taking rather than giving. To whatever extent this is true, it is the result of a radical individualism that emerged out of the European Enlightenment. The ancient Christian worldview in which a person flourishes within the concentric rings of overlapping relationships—nation, city, parish, family (all under God)—has been replaced by the idea of "each to his own."

The responsibilities a person once held towards others in their community has been supplanted by the demand for rights and privileges.

Some ideologies go so far as to outright reject all forms of altruism. The "selfish gene" is the means to human progress, they will say. Even so, society at large is shy about appearing self-serving. Many attempt to assuage their conscience by virtue signaling: by

supporting the right cause, buying the right products, or sending money to the right charity. But these superficial actions do not constitute true virtue; they cannot transform a person from a taker into a giver.

It is difficult for an Orthodox Christian living in this environment to break free from this mentality. Both those reared within the Church and those who convert to the faith carry around the baggage of our self-centered society. We may be tempted to approach our religion in terms of what we get out of it. When we think this way, Orthodoxy is reduced to an identity marker, a social program, or a "third space" to meet people. In other words, we come to

take from the Church rather than to give.

St. Paul writes in 2 Cor 9:7, "God loves a cheerful giver." This applies to everything we do. If God himself is  $agap\bar{e}$  or "selfless love" (1 Jn 4:8), then we are called to imitate and embody the same. Our fallen nature, of course, does not want to cooperate; so we must pushback by choosing selfless acts. Most importantly, we need to ask our Lord for grace in order to set aside our desires for the sake of others.

We can begin to change by taking small steps, such as being more courteous to

others during worship, cleaning up after ourselves at fellowship times, and volunteering for work days or various projects. And we can also be more generous in our donations to the parish, moving towards an actual tithe of our income and giving more to the needy. We must not wait until we feel "authentic" about such choices. It is best simply to act;

our feelings will eventually catch

up with us.

Our personal transformation is not about individual salvation, but about how we grow closer to Christ together. It begins with simple choices, a gentle trickle that slowly becomes a rushing river. But what begins within our parish can radiate outward to affect the local community, even our nation. It is then we will understand the power of our Lord's saying, "It is better to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).
